Featured speakers will include Moriah Beyers, M.S., Assistant Director of Academic Advising & Retention and instructor in the Department of Animal and Food Sciences at Texas Tech University, and Jay Killough, Ph.D., director of the TTU Career Center. The evening will also include a panel of four agriculture students from West Texas A&M University and Texas Tech University who will share their college experiences and offer advice to prospective students.
